

## Minutes for Health and Human Services meeting on 11-11-10

Meeting was held at Mt. View Hospital. Lincoln Court provided lunch.

- There was a tour of EITC done and booth placements were discussed and the amount of space available was also looked at. The bottom floor will be used for booths and presentations and the top floor will be used for services. There are 4 presentation rooms available on the bottom floor.
- There are currently 18 registration forms in with 3 more that are expected this week. We will still do one on one visits to try and get more people signed up for booths. Please keep making contacts. There are still people that need signs and we should have more in a couple of weeks. Kerry Huggins will be getting the posts for the signs and then Janell Price and Melissa Quattlebaum will deliver them to the businesses.

- Advertising. We are going to start advertising with light radio ads the day after Thanksgiving, then increase them on Dec. 10 and saturate after Dec. 21. We need to look at budget. We are also going to try to get some of the radio stations to do sponsorships. Kerry Huggins will be putting the HHS info in newsletters and any chamber advertising. We are also looking at placing some ads in the Post Register on Sundays. Suggestions were made to also try and get it in the Idaho Falls Magazine.
- There will also be a blood drive the day of the Health fair. It will run from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. and it will be in Rm 242. We will need to provide 3 volunteers. A greeter, a refreshment aide, and a walker. They will arrive to set up at 8:30 a.m. the morning of the event. They also need at least 20 people signed up. As soon as Melissa Quattlebaum gets the packets from the Red Cross she will provide the committee with blood drive sheets and posters to put up.
- Janell Price will start going to the Legislative Committee for the Health and Human Services Committee. We will start discussing health care bills at meetings so that Janell can go to the Legislative committee with our concerns and comments.
- Janell Price and Melissa Quattlebaum will be meeting with TRPTA to see if they can work something out with them for transportation on Jan. 8 for the health fair.
- As a committee we need to start working on our vision and goals for 2011. We need to have a networking calendar. Jim Hammon challenged us to figure out how we as a committee can give something back to the medical community of chamber.
